Joining us in Year 7

A School for Everyone.

We're proud to be a diverse and inclusive comprehensive school and sixth form truly representative of our city.

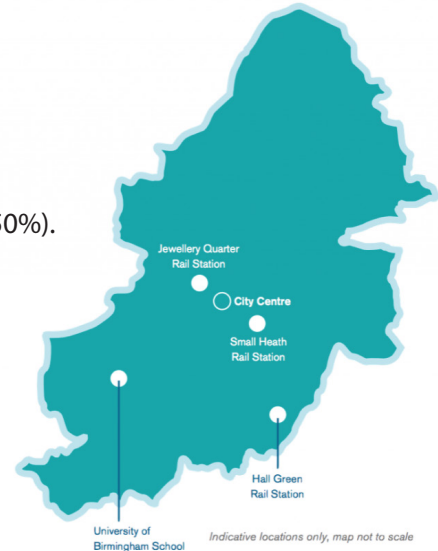
We are academically non-selective in Year 7 to 11 and take pupils from four 'nodes' across Birmingham to create a diverse learning community. We provide our pupils with the opportunity to learn earlier in life that the world is full of different people, cultures and attitudes which helps to build great character and more rounded citizens.

Each year we admit 150 pupils. We don't have a specific 'catchment area' as we operate a nodal system, taking pupils from four different locations across Birmingham.

A node is a central point, determined by co-ordinates on a map, and not a postcode area, from which measurements will begin. Our nodes are the main reception entrance of the School, and the entrance of the railway stations in Hall Green, the Jewellery Quarter and Small Heath.

The determined number of pupils admitted from each node, per year, is:

- The University of Birmingham School main entrance – up to 75 pupils (50%).
- Hall Green Station – up to 25 pupils (16.7%).
- Jewellery Quarter Station – up to 25 pupils (16.7%).
- Small Heath Station – up to 25 pupils (16.7%).



Distance will be calculated by Birmingham City Council as a straight line measurement between the applicant's home and the main entrance of the nearest node (as the crow flies). In the event that a tie break situation occurs for the distance criteria, a random allocation tie break will be used.
