Before you apply: Researching schools

Schools you can apply for

You can list up to six different secondary schools as preferences in your application. This can include schools outside of Birmingham.

Birmingham City Council runs a co-ordinated admissions scheme with neighbouring local authorities.

If you are applying for schools in another local authority then we recommend that you contact them for their admissions arrangements as this will help you to decide if your application is likely to be successful.

Birmingham City Council will only deal with applications for school places if you live in Birmingham and pay council tax to the authority.

If you live in Birmingham your application must still be made to Birmingham City Council.

Admission arrangements

Oversubscription

Oversubscription criteria

For community schools in Birmingham, Birmingham Local Authority is the admission authority and sets their admission arrangements, including their oversubscription criteria. When a community school receives more applications than it has places available, the places will be offered in the following criteria order:

- 1. Looked After Children (in public care) or previously Looked After Children
- 2. Siblings (brother or sister who will still be in attendance in September 2018)
- 3. Distance (children who live nearest the school)

Within each of these categories, priority is given to those who live nearest the school. This is calculated on the basis of a straight line measurement between the child's home address and the school. This is usually measured to the centre point of the school unless otherwise stated in the individual school's information.

For each academy, foundation, grammar, voluntary aided and free school in Birmingham, the school's Governing Body is the admission authority and sets its own admission arrangements, including oversubscription criteria. Please see schools' own information for details of the oversubscription criteria of individual academy, foundation, grammar, voluntary aided and free secondary schools and schools which admit pupils at Year 10.

If your child attends any of the following all-through schools in Year 6; Ark Kings Academy, Bournville School, Washwood Heath Academy or Waverley School please **do not** list the school as one of your six preferences.

Your child will automatically move up from Year 6 to Year 7 in September 2022 and by listing the school as a preference you are wasting one of your preferences.

Important: Ensure you include details of any siblings attending your preferred school(s) in the field (box) provided for sibling details. Sibling details included in the incorrect field (box), such as in reasons for preference. Will not be counted and may prevent you from gaining a place at your preferred school. Please note if you fill in the online application incorrectly, you are liable for not completing the form correctly, not School Admissions and Fair Access Service.

Applications to transfer to Secondary School in September 2022 open on 1 September 2021.



List six secondary schools in order of preference

Make sure you have read the admission arrangements fully for the schools you are interested in and know how likely it is that your child will be offered a place there. It is important that you include at least one realistic preference for a school that your child would have met the
