World Book Day

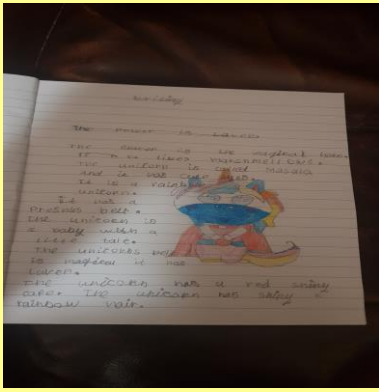
Next week we will be celebrating World Book day all week!

Look out for daily reading challenges to encourage reading at home:

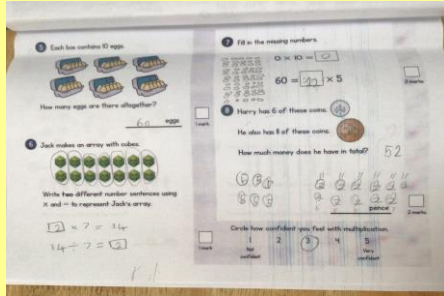
- Monday - read in your pyjamas!

Don't forget to find a potato and take part in the Potato Book Character competition!

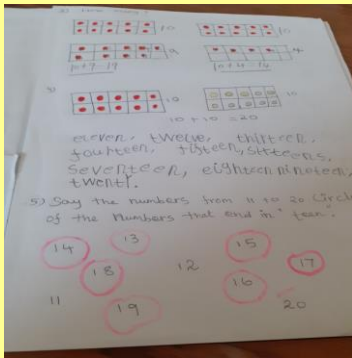

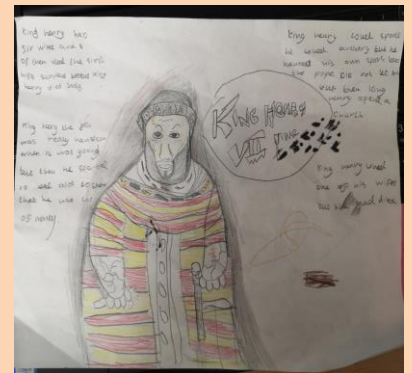
School spaghetti
