Dear Parents and Carers.

You should all have received a letter about strike action taking place next week. I would like to repeat that members of the NEU are striking because they disagree with the government and not with Springfield as an individual school.

There is also a teacher training day on Thursday, where we will be preparing for the next school year. This means that Springfield Primary will be closed on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday next week.

Bring it on Brum! Summer Holiday Clubs

Bring it on Brum! is running FREE activity clubs in Birmingham for those children and young people aged 4-16 who are eligible for benefits-related free school meals.

Throughout the summer school holidays, each club runs for up to 4 weeks and each child is eligible to attend a maximum of 16 sessions. Activities include sports and games, arts and crafts, cookery, dance and music. Programmes will vary depending on the type of provision and location of each club, but every day young people will get a nutritious meal served up for free!

Bookings for summer holiday clubs will open from **Monday, 3 July**

The website will be updated regularly as new providers are confirmed so if families cannot find a suitable holiday club straight away, they should check back regularly.

Can't attend a face-to-face holiday club? For families with children who are not able to access face-to-face holiday clubs, activity packs are also available for the summer school holiday. Packs are available one per eligible child for primary or secondary age. Families can register for a free summer activity pack from Monday, 26 June 2023; registrations close on Wednesday, 12 July 2023 or as soon as all activity packs have been allocated.
